Dalawampung mangisda mula sa Barangay Alegria sa Isla ng Semirara ang unang grupong nakatanggap ng *fiberglass* banca mula sa SMPC at ng Department of Energy (DOE).

Ipinagkaloob ang mga bangka sa mga residente noong Nobyembre 3 at Disyembre 23, 2021, na pinangunahan ng mga opisyal ng SMPC, DOE at lokal na pamahalaang barangay ng Alegria.

Sa programang pangkabuhayan ito ng SMPC, lahat ng kagamitan sa paggawa ng *fiberglass* banca ay libreng ipinagkaloob ng SMPC at DOE kasama na ang 7.5 horsepower na makina nito, elesi, at timon.

Bilang counterpart ng mga mangisda, sila ang sama-samang gumawa ng kanilang mga bangka sa tulong ng ilang ekspertong kawani ng Municipal Agricultural Office ng Caluya na siyang nagturo kanila kung paano gumawa ng bangkang yari sa *fiberglass*.

Ang *fiberglass* banca ay tiyak na matibay at nagtagalog ng mula 40 hanggang 50 taon ayon sa mga eksperto.

Sa ganitong pamamaraan ay naiwasan din ang pagputol ng mga punong-kahoy upang gawin bangka, bagay na nakatutulong sa pag-iingat sa ating kalikasan.

Layunin ng programang ito na

magkaloob ng 25 bangka sa bawat 3 barangay sa isla bilang bahagi ng selebrasyon ng ika-25 na anibersaryo ng SMPC sa pamamahala ng DMCI Holdings.

Naging madamdamin ang mensahe ni Lolita Brabonga, maybahay ni Amelito Brabonga, isa sa benepisyaryo ng proyekto kung saan ibinahagi niya ang kanilang labis na kaligayahan sa pagtanggap ng bangkang *fiberglass*.

"High school pa po ako, pangingisa na ang aming pinagkukunan ng kabuhayan. Pangarap namin noon pa man na magkaroon ng sariling bangka. Sa ngayon gamit lang po namin ay bangkang gawa sa styro at sinasagwan lang namin kasi wala kaming pambili ng bangka. Ngayon po maraming-maraming salamat sa SMPC! Nabigyan kami ng bangka, kaya salamat, salamat po talaga sa lahat-lahat," aniya.





SMPC donates additional 9,000 antigen kits to Antique

Last April, SMPC donated 3,000 rapid antigen test kits to the Antique provincial government to aid its mass testing program, totaling the donation to 12,500 kits for the entire province this year.

“Along with COVID-19 vaccination, the test and trace strategy still remain as among the most important strategies to our fight against COVID. Given the threat of the Omicron variant, we must continue to remain steadfast in protecting our people with the immediacy and convenience that

antigen test kits can provide,” said Caluya Mayor Rigil Kent Lim.

SMPC is providing free accommodations to PHO and MHO medical teams who administer the jabs for residents of Semirara Island. SMPC also volunteered free use of its 2,900-meter food court as the island’s vaccination site that can accommodate 200 vaccinees per day.

“SMPC played a substantial role in the vaccination program. Through their initiative and encouragement of their employees (and family) to get vaccinated, it helped boost the vaccination status of the island,” said

Caluya MHO chief Dr. Anna Marie Villalobos.

As of December 20, about 6,800 island residents and SMPC employees—roughly 40% of the island’s eligible population from ages 12 and above—have been fully inoculated with doses of CoronaVac (Sinovac), Oxford-AstraZeneca, Moderna, Pfizer-BioNTech, or Johnson & Johnson Janssen vaccines, according to the Caluya MHO.

SMPC is the only power producer in the country that owns and mines its own fuel source, allowing it to generate affordable and reliable baseload power for the Luzon and Visayas grids.

Over 80 stakeholders from different sectors in Semirara Island attended SMPC's year-end report and stakeholder thanksgiving on December 18, 2021.

The event held at the SMPC mess hall tackled SMPC's accomplishments on its environmental stewardship programs, social development programs, community health response through its Semirara Infirmary, and human resources management.

The inaugural event was attended by officials of local government units in Caluya and Semirara Island led by Mayor Rigel Kent Lim, members of the academe, religious groups, and non-governmental organizations.

"Ito siguro ang unang pagkakataon na punung-puno ang mess hall at lahat po ng organisasyon sa Semirara Island ay kasama. Maraming salamat sa initiative na ito ng SMPC na nagbibigay sila sa atin ng report para aware tayo sa mga nangyayari," said Brgy. Semirara chair Catherine Lim.

SMPC pinaigting ang kaligtasan ng empleyado kontra COVID-19

Sa kabilang patuloy na banta sa kalusugan ng COVID-19, tinitiyak ng SMPC na maipagpapatuloy nito ang ligtas at maayos na serbisyo sa mga stakeholders nito habang inuuna ang kalusugan ng mga empleyado.

Bilang isang “essential industry,” ang SMPC ay sinisigurong ligtas ang lugar ng paggawa sa pagpapaigting ng mga *basic health procedures, engineering controls (floor signs, barriers, atbp.)*, at agarang pagbigay ng mga *medical services*.

Sa pakikipag-ugnayan sa lokal na pamahalaan ng Caluya, Antique, siniguro din ng SMPC na mabakunahan ang mga empleyado bilang proteksyon sa COVID-19. Sa kabuuan, 92 porsyento ng empleyado ng SMPC ang *fully-vaccinated* na kontra COVID-19.

“Maswerte kaming empleyado dahil may ganitong programa ang SMPC. Lalo na sa katulad kong may *comorbidity*, abot kamay ang bakuna at protektado ang sarili at ang pamilya,” ani Joel Flores, *SSR analyst*.

SCPC, SLPGC upscale Adopt-A-Forest Program

Over 10,000 seedlings of narra, molave, and mahogany were planted by SMPC's subsidiaries SEM-Calaca Power Corporation (SCPC) and Southwest Luzon Power Generation Corporation (SLPGC) at its adopted 50-hectare upland forest site at Barangay Patugo, Balayan, Batangas to surpass its annual 5,000 seedling target.

The program commenced during the rainy season and ensured the greater survival of the planted trees. Additionally, we regularly disseminated information to the DENR-CENRO to promote sustainable forest management and prevent slash and burn farming (kaingin) methods. We also provided fruit-bearing tree seedlings to the community.

To ensure the continuing success of our sustainable Adopt-A-Forest program, we will upscale the adopted site by another 50 hectares and extend it to other areas, such as Mt. Makiling Forest Reserve (*with reports from The Current, the Official Community Relations Newsletter of SCPC and SLPGC*).



DOE kicks-off 2021 National Energy Consciousness Month

TAGUIG CITY—The Department of Energy (DOE) on Wednesday (1 December) virtually kicked off the month-long celebration of the National Energy Consciousness Month (NECM) for 2021.

With the theme, “Committed to Serve: Building a Better Normal by Forging Ahead through Energy Ability, Security, and Sustainability,” the NECM’s annual observance seeks to instill a strong foundation of energy literacy and awareness among Filipinos, while highlighting their crucial role in defining the energy future of the country.

In his inspirational message, Energy Secretary Alfonso G. Cusi emphasized that this year’s NECM captures the Department’s objective to “uphold and enhance the well-being of Filipino energy consumers.”

Energy Efficiency and Conservation (EE&C) seminars for government offices and entities in different regions;

The DOE will also host several internal programs—such as bloodletting programs, virtual seminar on health and wellness, and the virtual chorale singing contest—to celebrate its 49th anniversary.

In 2007, then-President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo signed Proclamation No. 1427, declaring December of every year as NECM, to coincide with the DOE’s anniversary.
