
In the coming years, SMPC's dedication to promoting inclusive growth is expected to continue its positive impacts to its stakeholders and the communities where it operates.

## SMPC Launches Scubasurero Program & Coastal Clean-up Drive on Semirara Island

Cleaning up our coastline is a shared responsibility for marine biodiversity. Semirara Mining and Power Corporation (SMPC), the Department of Energy (DoE), the Barangay Local Government of Semirara, and local volunteers from Sitio Villarises on Semirara Island came together for a Coastal Clean-up drive on October 17, 2022. The drive engaged employees, regulators, and 100 residents from host communities to clean and remove trash and marine debris along Pinagpala Pier.

The Environmental and Biodiversity Department led the activity as part of its commitment to environmental stewardship. On the same day, the department launched the Scubasurero Program, which aims to protect marine life and commits to regularly conducting underwater clean-ups to minimize trash and marine debris in the sea.

An Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) campaign was conducted to increase the community's awareness of the extent of water pollution and marine life debris problems.

This program is part of SMPC's commitment to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs), notably Life Below Water (SDG 14) and Climate Action (SDG 13).

#### **SMPC** empowers women of Tinogboc with dressmaking and tailoring livelihood project

Integrated energy company Semirara Mining and Power Corporation (SMPC) boosts women empowerment in its host communities by expanding its dressmaking and tailoring livelihood program to the Women's Association of barangay Tinogboc in Semirara Island, in partnership with the Department of Energy (DoE) and the Local Government Unit of Tinogboc.

The provision of a suitable property, ten additional high-speed sewing machines, dressmaking, and tailoring training has so far enabled the women in the community to produce masks, rags, and other higher-value products such as SMPC uniforms, school uniforms, curtains, and teachers' uniforms, providing an additional source of income for their families. Further financial management and marketing strategy workshops will also be provided to develop their income-generating capacity. The dressmaking and tailoring livelihood project targets to operate in full swing by the first quarter of 2023.


This project replicates the Barangay Semirara dressmaking livelihood program initiated in 2019, with SMPC providing ten high-speed sewing machines and establishing a women's cooperative, which now has 14 active members and generated over Php1.6M in revenue.













#### SMPC, medical volunteers serve 787 Semiraranhons

A total of 787 residents of Semirara Island in Caluya, Antique benefited from the one-day joint medical mission conducted by the St. Padre Pio Contemplative Prayer Group-Bacolod City (SPPCPG-Bacolod), Semirara Mining and Power Corporation (SMPC) and the Barangay Local Government Units (BLGUs) on August 20, 2022.

SMPC, together with the BLGUs Barangay Health Workers and staff, were all hands on deck to assist in making the event successful and ensuring that COVID-19 health protocols were properly observed.

The 39-strong medical team consisted of volunteer doctors, nurses, and allied health professionals, with 32 from SPPCPG-Bacolod and seven from SMPC Infirmary. Free medical services included pediatric check-ups, eye and other general consultations, while 15 minor surgeries involved the excision of lymphoma, sebaceous cysts as well as breast mass. Vitamin supplements, maintenance medicines, and eyeglasses were also distributed for free.

SMPC provided an accessible venue, free laboratory expenses, additional medicines and supplies, as well as the visiting mission team's housing, accommodation, and transportation. BLGU Semirara provided free transportation for the beneficiaries to and from the venue.

"Those who availed the medical mission belong to the vulnerable and economically disadvantaged sectors, like senior citizens, children, and members of their coastal fishing community. Although basic health services are available on the island, the augmentation of medical services by SMPC and private groups like SPPCPG-Bacolod are always welcome," Liga President/Barangay Captain Catherine "Kikai" Lim of Barangay Semirara said.





#### Making a difference

Dr. Norma Legislador, founder of SPPCPG-Bacolod, explained that the event marked their group's first medical mission since the COVID-19 pandemic and is part of the advanced commemoration of the feast day of St. Padre Pio on September 23.





"It is very rewarding to make a difference in other people's lives. You know that by leaving your comfortable house and clinic for three days, traveling 14 hours by land and sea, performing surgery for 30 minutes that will solve someone's long-term health problem, that thought alone will make you feel good," said Dr. Jundad.



Michael Sta. Maria of Barangay Alegria was among the minor surgery patients. Several sebaceous cysts on his body were excised by SPPCPG-Bacolod's surgeon, Dr. Jundad Legislador, who was assisted by SMPC Infirmary's Dr. Paul Jude Melsam Aquino and purses



Another resident, Roseller Domingo of Barangay Tinogboc, said that the medical mission eased the burden on his family for needed prescription medicines and supplements. "Nagpapasalamat ako dahil isa ako sa maraming natulungan. Pati asawa ko nakapagpasukat ng mata," he added.





SMPC maintains and operates a 15-bed infirmary with basic and ancillary medical services such as laboratory, x-ray, dental, and pharmacy on Semirara Island. It also provides free medical consultation services to the local residents.

# Semirara Island Community Comes Together for Emergency Action Group Training

Semirara Mining and Power Corporation (SMPC), in partnership with the International Disaster and Response Network (IDRN), the Municipal Local Government of Caluya, and the Barangay Local Government Units of Semirara, Tinogboc, and Alegria, conducted the Semirara Island Emergency Action Group Training from November 24 to 28, 2022.

The training was part of SMPC's 25th-anniversary lineup of activities and aimed to achieve zero casualties in case of any disaster on Semirara Island. Participants included SMPC employees, community residents, and key community groups.

The five-day event focused on retraining and assessing the management team and emergency responders from local organizations to enhance their skills in responding to emergencies.

To achieve this, coordination and interoperability mechanisms were developed among the stakeholders on the island, and the competency of the response group was tested through a rescue and lifesaving competition called Rescuree. The exercises also reinforced Community-Based Disaster Preparedness.









The training covered various emergency scenarios such as Emergency Medical Response, Collapse Search and Rescue, Water Search and Rescue, Firefighting, Search Rescue Retrieval and Recovery, and High and Low Angle Rescue, which IDRN demonstrated.

The various training sessions were held at different SMPC facilities such as the Foodcourt, Olympic-size Swimming Pool, Sports Complex, Old Main Workshop, and Oval.

A total of 266 participants were led by the SMPC Emergency Response Team and Community Relations Department.


